## Urs Bryner MD, Surgeon

Urs M. Bryner was born to Elizabeth and Alfred Bryner on May 7, 1946, in Winterthur, Switzerland. He was a dutiful son who worked hard in school but always wanted to become a physician. When the time came, he chose

to leave his beloved Switzerland and immigrate to the United States, where he pursued a degree in medicine. At the young age of 19, Urs came to the US with the shirt on his back and without a working knowledge of the English Language. He attended La Sierra University for a short time to take his prerequisite courses for Loma Linda University. More importantly, however, this is where he met the love of his life, Darlene Wuerstlin. She was a freshman, and he was a senior. They fell in love quickly and were married in July 1969.

Around that same time, Urs found a sponsor who would help fund his academic dream and he began his career at Loma Linda University, School of Medicine. He graduated from medical school with the class of 1973-b and finished his surgical residency in 1979 with a specialty in vascular surgery. Somewhere in there, he also managed to father Marcus (1974; LLU graduate 2000) and Stephanie (1976). Now it was time to put this newfound medical degree to use.

With a dream in his heart, Urs and his young family moved to Yreka, California in 1979, where the Swiss immigrant would build the American dream. After moving to Siskiyou County, Urs began the painstaking process of building a private practice. The happy family moved into their custom Swiss-style home in 1981. The house, designed by Urs, was nestled on 20 acres in Siskiyou County with views of Mount Shasta. In 1983, Carrie, the youngest of the three children, was born.

Over the years, Urs developed a private surgical practice serving the community he loved. He developed the first known electronic medical record system (“ClinTrac”), an integrated scheduling, patient record, and order system used in his Yreka office, Mount Shasta, California, and Portland, Oregon. Urs was the first physician to bring Laparoscopic surgical techniques to Siskiyou County. He established a partnership with Steve Nelson, MD (LLU graduate 1978) that lasted 31 years. However, as his practice grew, he felt God’s calling to the mission field in China. Partnering with LLU, Urs took Darlene, Stephanie, and Carrie to Hangzhou, China, where he served as an associate professor of general and vascular surgery, teaching Chinese residents the newfound specialty of laparoscopic surgery. For two years, he worked to instruct young medical professionals on the finer points of western medicine.

Returning stateside, Urs continued his surgical practice and won the LLU Surgeon of the Year Award in 1996. However, he always had a heart for China, returning whenever he could. As life progressed, he watched his children marry and learned the joy of being a grandfather. He was a devout Seventh-Day Adventist Christian. He loved his church and was a very active member. He was an elder, taught Bible studies, sang in the choir, and even preached occasionally. Some of his many hobbies included singing barbershop, gardening, traveling the world, classical music, driving his Mercedes with the top down, and snow-skiing in his beloved Swiss Alps. But most of all, he loved his family. He is survived by his loving wife of 45 years, three children, and eight grandchildren. Urs was a man who loved life and cherished every second given to him. He adored his family, but most of all, he loved Jesus and went to his unexpected rest on Dec. 14, 2014, knowing his friend Jesus was coming back soon and would make all things new.

Fairchild Medical Center was appreciative of everything Dr. Bryner brought to the facility, such as the addition of Laparoscopic surgery, a great service to offer the people of Siskiyou County.

Dr. Bryner was admired, and his work ethics were what you would wish for in a surgeon. He is missed every day, and we remember him on the 10th anniversary of his passing.

## ACTIVE SHOOTER DRILL

On Friday January 10, Patrol and Correctional Deputies from the Siskiyou County Sheriff’s Office were invited to participate in the Fairchild Medical Center’s Active Shooter Drill along with CHP - Yreka, Yreka Police Department, EMS, and fire personnel.

During this drill, the shooter fired simunitions, and individual staff members acted as mass casualties for the various emergency medical personnel to respond to and practice triaging. Law enforcement personnel were then alerted to a shooting in progress and responded to the medical center to locate and eliminate the threat.

It was an extremely valuable learning and training experience for everyone, including over 40 staff members from the Fairchild Medical Clinics, allowing us to prepare for worst-case scenarios such as an active shooter in a medical facility. The event was planned over a six month period, and will be followed by a lessons learned discussion with all agencies involved.

We’d like to extend our sincere thanks to Fairchild Medical Center for including us in this critical training, and to CHP - Yreka for their role in making this training possible for Siskiyou County. It is through cooperative learning opportunities such as these that our first responder agencies can be best prepared for whatever incidents come our way.



# BOTULISM

Winter is in full swing, the holidays are over and as we await the arrival of spring and the fresh fruit and vegetables that come with it, we look to our pantries for the various canned items we prepared from last year's harvest. Canned food is a great way to enjoy things such as fish, meat, fruits and vegetables year round. Just be aware that if not prepared properly, you can become very sick and though rare, possibly die from eating food contaminated with the bacteria that causes botulism. Botulism is caused by the bacteria *Clostridium botulinum*, which produces a dangerous toxin that quickly spreads into the bloodstream, attaching to nerves that soon become paralyzed and no longer work. The three most common forms of botulism include:

- **Foodborne botulism:** Results from eating food containing the bacteria, stored in an environment with little oxygen allowing it to thrive and produce the toxin. The usual source is homemade food that is improperly canned or preserved such as fruits, vegetable and fish. Symptoms typically begin 12-36 hours after ingesting the contaminated food.
- **Wound botulism:** Occurs when a cut or puncture wound becomes contaminated with the bacteria, resulting in a dangerous infection. Symptoms usually appear about 10 days after sustaining the wound.
- **Infant botulism:** Occurs in a baby's intestinal tract, usually between 2 and 8 months of age. One reason this occurs is by ingesting honey; therefore, the CDC recommends not feeding honey to infants younger than 12 months of age. Symptoms generally begin 18-36 hours after entering the infant's intestine.

Symptoms include trouble swallowing or speaking, facial weakness on both sides of the face, blurred or double vision, drooping eyelids, trouble breathing, nausea, vomiting and stomach cramps and possibly paralysis. Symptoms of infant botulism also include constipation (often the first symptom), floppy movements due to muscle weakness and trouble controlling the head, weak cry, drooling and difficulty sucking or feeding.

If you or someone you know is experiencing these symptoms see your health-care provider, go to the nearest hospital emergency room or call 911. Botulism can be prevented from worsening with an antitoxin that blocks the action of the toxin circulating in the blood. People diagnosed with this disease are often admitted to a hospital for close observation and management of symptoms. Sometimes, if they are having trouble breathing, they may require a breathing machine (ventilator). Botulism can be fatal if left untreated, but most people who receive a prompt diagnosis and treatment make a full recovery.

## BROCCOLI CHEDDAR SOUP

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Cook Time: 25 minutes • Serves 4



This broccoli cheddar soup recipe is easy to make in just 30 minutes! Creamy, rich, and flavorful, it's comfort food at its best. Serve it with homemade croutons or good crusty bread.

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 medium yellow onion, chopped
- ½ teaspoon sea salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 3 garlic cloves, chopped
- ¼ cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups whole milk or unsweetened almond milk
- 2 cups vegetable broth
- 3 cups chopped broccoli florets
- 1 large carrot, julienned or finely chopped
- ½ teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 8 ounces shredded cheddar cheese, about 2 heaping cups
- Homemade croutons, for serving, optional

Melt the butter in a large pot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Add the onion, salt, and several grinds of pepper and cook, stirring, for 5 minutes, or until softened. Stir in the garlic and cook for another minute, then sprinkle in the flour and whisk continuously for 1 to 2 minutes, or until the flour turns golden. Slowly pour in the milk, whisking continuously.

Add the broth, broccoli, carrot, and mustard and stir to combine. Simmer for 15 to 20 minutes, or until the broccoli is tender.

Gradually add the cheese, stirring after each addition, until all the cheese is melted and the soup is creamy. Season to taste and serve with croutons, if desired.
